MUSLIMS IN SOUTH AFRICA

- Muslims arrived in South Africa from three directions in three "waves" as follows:
 - From Indonesia to Cape Town mid 1600's onwards
 - From India to Durban 1860 onwards
- From the African continent and elsewhere mainly post 1994
- Between 1770 and 1800 Islam spread rapidly in the Cape through labourers and ex-slaves who witnessed the sober habits and other exemplary teachings of Islam.
- South Africa's first Mosque 'Awwal Masjid' was established in Bo-Kaap, Cape Town in 1793
- The first Muslim cemetery was allocated in 1805, also in Cape Town.
- The Western Cape has the largest concentration of Muslims, followed by

- Gauteng and KwaZulu-Natal.
- Today, Muslims are spread throughout South Africa and contribute significantly towards the economic growth of the country. There are approximately 700 Masajid (places of worship) as well as hundreds of primary Madrasahs (educational centres), close to a hundred Muslim Schools and a dozen or so Islamic Colleges (Darul Ulooms). Islamic publications are plentiful and there are a number of Islamic Radio Stations. Scores of Muslim NGO's render a variety of services in education, welfare, dawah, social, cultural and other areas, both locally and internationally.
- A number of Muslims have served in the past and continue to serve presently as Cabinet Ministers, MP's, Mayors, Councillors, Judges, Magistrates, senior civil servants and in other government posts.
- Muslims enjoy a high level of religious freedom. They have integrated seamlessly into the fabric of South African society, living as a law-abiding community and existing harmoniously and peacefully along with other faith groups in the country.
- Muslims are actively involved in poverty alleviation programmes and have contributed to the establishment of schools, creches, clinics, orphanages, boreholes, soup kitchens, feeding schemes and other such projects for the destitute and under privileged in the country. The extensive charity of the South African Muslim community is wellacknowledged and widely appreciated.
