# Sunnahs of Eidul-Adha

- 1. To wake up early in the morning (earlier than usual).
- 2. To clean one's teeth with Miswak.
- 3. To take a bath (Sunnah bath).
- 4. To wear one's best available clothes.
- 5. To use perfume (Itr).
- 6. Not to eat before the Eid Salaah.
- 7. To partake of the meat from the Qurbani animal first.
- 8. To recite the Takbir of Tashriq in a loud voice whilst going to the Eid Salaah and returning.
- 9. To go to the Eid Salaah on one route and return from another.
- 10. To go to the place of Salaah early.

#### Distribution of the Meat

If an animal is sacrificed by more than one person, like a cow or a camel, its meat should be distributed equally among its owners by weighing the meat strictly and not at random or by mere guess. Even if all the partners agree on its distribution without weighing, it is still not permissible according to Shari'ah.

However, if the actual weighing is not practicable due to some reason, and all the partners agree to distribute the meat without weighing, distribution by guess can be done with the condition that each share necessarily contains either a leg of the animal or some quantity of its liver.

Although the person offering a Qurbani can keep all its meat for his own use, yet, it is preferable to distribute one-third among the poor, another one-third among his relatives and then, keep the rest for his personal consumption.

All parts of the sacrificed animal can be used for personal benefit, but none can be sold, nor can be given to the butcher as a part of his wages. If somebody has sold the meat of the Qurbani or its skin, he must give the accrued price as Sadaqah to a poor man who can receive Zakah.

# Sacrifice & Striving - the staircase to spiritual elevation

Another lesson in sacrificing of time and money and ongoing striving!

This is the essence of the life of a believer in this world, from start to end, it is non-stop sacrifice and striving!

All of these micro occasions of sacrifice and striving prepares a Muslim for greater sacrifices, until he is ready and willing for the ultimate sacrifice of his own life, wealth, health and everything for the sake of Allah.

### THE HOLY QURAN BUILDS A MINDSET OF STRIVING AND SACRIFICE

Over and over, the Holy Quran repeats the theme of striving and sacrifice: "And strive (jahidu) for Allah in such an endeavour which is His right." (22:78) Also refer to verses 29:6 and 84:6.

The repeated mention of the theme of sacrifice & striving in so many verses of the Holy Quran, indicates that the Holy Quran wishes to prepare and build the mindset of the Muslim for ongoing sacrifice and striving in this world. There is no place in a Muslim's life for laziness, lethargy, indolence, carelessness, negligence and heedlessness.

This Eid, let each one make a firm resolution to banish these despicable traits once and for all.

In fact, nothing is achieved even of worldly benefit, without effort, striving and sacrifice, then how can the endless bliss of the Hereafter be achieved without it, merely on wishful thinking or pious hopes?

## The Sunnah Method of Qurbani

- •It is more preferable for a Muslim to slaughter the animal of his *Qurbani* with his own hands. However, if he is unable to slaughter the animal himself, or does not want to do so for some reason, he can request another person to slaughter it on his behalf. In this case also, it is more preferable that he, at least, be present at the time of slaughter. However, his absence at the time of slaughter does not render the *Qurbani* invalid, if he has authorized the person who slaughtered the animal on his behalf.
- It is a Sunnah to lay the animal with its face towards the Qiblah, and to recite the following verse of the Holy Quran: "I, being upright, turn my face towards the One who has created the heavens and the earth, and I am not among those who associate partners with Allah." (Al-An'am, 6:79)
- •But the most essential recitation when slaughtering an animal is: Bismillah, Allahu Akbar. (In the name of Allah, Allah is the greatest). If somebody intentionally avoids to recite it when slaughtering an animal, it does not only make his Qurbani unlawful, but also renders the animal haram, and it is not permissible to eat the meat of that animal. However, if a person did not avoid this recitation intentionally, but he forgot to recite it when slaughtering the animal, this mistake is forgiven and both the Qurbani and the slaughter are lawful.
- •If somebody is unable to recite "Bismillah Allahu Akbar" in the Arabic language, he can recite the name of Allah in his own language by saying, "In the name of Allah".

# The reality of Qurbani

The memorial sacrifice of Ibrahim is a lesson for every Believer in every time and era, that in order to attain the pleasure of Allah Ta'ala, one has to sacrifice everything of his. This is the highest stage of perfection for humanity.

The sacrificing of animals, which has been made incumbent on the Muslims every year, has the status of a memorial to Ibrahim . Another point which becomes apparent, is that to give as Sadaqah the price of an animal, cannot absolve one from this Fard obligation and hence cannot fulfill the memorial of Ibrahim ...

The intention of Qurbani is not to eat or feed the meat of Qurbani, but to fulfil a Shar'ee command and to renew the commemoration of the Sunnah of Ibrahim , and to create the spirit and desire of selflessness and sacrifice. The actual purpose of Qurbani, is to create a desire of obedience and submission in a human being.

# The Spirit of Qurbani

The whole idea of Qurbani is to bring the reality of Qurbani - sacrifice - into our lives. Qurbani is not just a customary ritual.

Shariah has emphasized this to the extent that even the women are told to slaughter with their own hands. If they cannot, for any reason slaughter the animal themselves, then they should be present, with Hijab arrangements.

Another aspect of Qurbani is that we should keep the animals with us for a while where ever possible, before slaughtering.

## Acceptance of Hajj

The Fuqahaa have written that the sign of acceptance of one's Hajj is that one's condition improves after the Hajj. One follows the Sunnah more meticulously, one has more inclination to practice good deeds and an aversion to sin.

#### Which animals are not suitable for Qurbani?

The following animals are not suitable for Qurbani - Animals whose horn(s) has been broken off from the root

- An animal that is blind, one-eyed or has lost more than one-third of its eyesight.
- Animals that have lost more than a third of the ear. Similarly, animals which have no ears from birth.
- Animals which are lame to the extent that it walks on three legs only and is unable to use the fourth leg. However if the animal can walk to the place of slaughter on the fourth leg with a limp it will be allowed.
- Animals so lean and thin that their bones have no marrow.

Can a man purchase the Qurbani animal for his wife with his wealth, even if she can afford it?

A man may purchase his wife's animal from his wealth with her consent.

#### Can one use the skin of the Qurbani animal?

It is permissible to use the skin for one's personal use, eg. he may use it as a Musalla/mat. However, if the skin is sold, it is not permissible to use the income thereof. It is Wajib to give it (the income) in charity. It is not permissible to give the skin in lieu of any services rendered.




