DID YOU KNOW?

MOVING OF THE LIPS IN SALAAH

In Salah it is necessary to move the lips and tongue when reciting the different types of supplications, eg: Takbir Tahrimah (The Takbir to commence Salah), Qiraat, Tashahud, Salam, etc. If one does not verbally recite the necessary words by moving the lips and tongue but merely recites it in his heart, the Salah will be invalid.

This ruling will also apply when reciting the Quraan Shareef out of Salah. Though there is reward for merely looking into the Quraan Shareef, it is necessary to move the lips if one intends to reap the numerous rewards for Tilawah (recitation) of the Quraan Shareef. Many people recite the Quraan Shareef by merely looking through the words without moving their lips and tongue which unfortunately does not amount to Tilawah.

SCULPTURES/STATUES OF ANIMATE OBJECTS

Manufacturing, owning, displaying, buying and selling of sculptures or statues of animate beings (humans and animals) is prohibited in the Shariah. There is a consensus of the Jurists regarding this prohibition.

Many Muslim homes, offices, businesses, etc. display such statues in the form of decoration pieces and the like. It should be noted that the displaying of such objects is not permissible and prevents the angels of mercy from entering one's premises. (Bukhari: 5958)

Muslims are urged to immediately remove such objects from their homes, businesses, etc.

DAWAH - ARE WE NEGLECTING THIS IMPORTANT DUTY?

Dawah - the duty of conveying the true message of guidance to mankind and guiding them to the Straight Path of Islam - is being grossly neglected by Muslims at present. In the past, every Muslim regarded dawah as an important duty alongside other Islamic duties, as a result of which the Ummah numbers over a billion members globally. Unfortunately dawah has been neglected so much that now Muslims have virtually forgotten that dawah is a duty upon them. The result is that Muslims - those who were supposed to guide others - have themselves lost the way and have to be given the dawah.

When Nabi & commenced his dawah in the beginning, he was a single individual. One by one, people began to follow him to the Straight Path of Islam - until in a short period of just 23 years, over a hundred thousand people had embraced Islam. Upon his demise, this duty was transferred to his Ummah, to continue with his mission of dawah. His companions, the Sahaba (RA) undertook this duty with great zeal, sacrifice and dedication and in a short time, half the world was lit up with the light of Islam! As a result, the world experienced an unprecedented period of peace, prosperity and progress that was never witnessed before or after. Over the centuries this duty of dawah was generally neglected, which resulted in the decline of Muslims. The whole world suffered as a result of this. To revive this glorious era, Muslims will have to vigourously revive the dawah.

BENEFITS OF DAWAH

Regarding the benefit of dawah, Nabi said to Sayyidina Ali ... "O Ali! If Allah guides a single person through you, it will be better for you than the whole world and its contents." In one narration, "better than red camels (a very precious item)."

He also mentioned: "The person on whose hands a single person enters Islam, Jannah is compulsory for him."

On the Day of Qiyamah, will Nabi 🖔 not be extremely pleased and proud of those followers of his, who sacrificed their time and wealth to continue his mission of guidance, because of whom, many people came into Islam, and many were guided to the Straight Path. How fortunate will such people be on the Day of Judgment, when they will receive their honours and rewards!

DISCARDING THE DUTY OF DAWAH

The importance of Dawah - the effort of saving human beings from Hellfire - can be clearly understood from an example. If a blind person is about to walk into a well or hole, it is compulsory to break one's Salaah and save him from injury or death. Now, mankind who is blind (spiritually) is walking headlong towards the Fire of Hell. Can Muslims - those who can see - remain indifferent and watch casually as thousands fall into Hell whilst they are busy in their idle pursuits? Can the pilots of the helicopters on a rescue mission neglect the emergency task of saving thousands from drowning in a deadly flood, because they are too busy playing cards or games? Can the ambulance drivers leave dying patients to bleed to death, because they are too busy watching an exciting match? If this is unacceptable and regarded as criminal, how can the neglect of the duty of dawah - the mission to rescue humanity from the greatest disaster of the Hereafter then not be regarded as a criminal dereliction of duty?
