












Masjid Bilal






Qur'an Oasis in Madinah

ADINAH – The Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques, King Salman, approved the establishment of an iconic Qur'an Oasis project in Madinah.

This was announced by Prince Sultan bin Salman, president of the Saudi Commission for Tourism and National Heritage.

"The oasis will be an integrated world-class cultural and knowledge landmark that showcases everything pertaining to the holy book," he said.

The King also approved the allocation of 200,000 square meters of land along King Salman Road near Prince Muhammad International



Airport to implement the project in coordination with the Ministry of Islamic Affairs and in partnership of the private sector.

The Oasis project will display more than 3,000 rare manuscript copies of the holy book.

Israel inflicts 'apartheid regime' on Palestine

eport by UN Economic and Social Commission for Western Asia says world's ignorance has 'encouraged Tel Aviv.' The UN accused Israel of imposing an "apartheid regime" on the Palestinian people - the first time a UN agency had levelled such an allegation.

A report commissioned by the Beirut-based UN Economic and Social Commission for Western Asia (ESCWA) said Israel had "established an apartheid regime that dominates the Palestinian people as a whole".

UN Under-Secretary General and ESCWA Executive Secretary Rima Khalaf said the "ignorance of the international community, over the past decades, has encouraged Israel to continue its abuses of international law."

At a news conference in Beirut Khalaf said the report "clearly and frankly" concluded that "Israel is a racist state that has established an apartheid system that persecutes the Palestinian people.'

The report said there was "overwhelming evidence" of Israel's guilt of the "crime of apartheid".

It added that the "strategic fragmentation" of Palestinians into



four groups - Palestinian citizens of Israel; Palestinians in East Jerusalem; Palestinians in the West Bank and Gaza Strip; and Palestinian refugees or exiles - allowed Israel to carry out its apartheid policies.

A two-state solution cannot be applied until the "apartheid regime" is dismantled through international pressure, Khalaf said.

The report was prepared by Richard Falk, an international law and human rights expert and a former UN human rights rapporteur for the occupied territories, and Virginia Tilley, a political science professor and an expert in Israeli studies.



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Chemical weapons allegedly used 45 times

HE HAGUE: Experts from the Organization for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW) - the world's watchdog - tasked with destroying chemical weapons are probing reports that toxic arms have been used 45 times in Syria since late last

Ahmet Uzumcu, its director general, said there was "a huge list of allegations" of the use of toxic arms reported to the operations hub of the OPCW.

In the "second part of 2016, 30 different incidents, and since the beginning of this year, 15 separate incidents, so 45," he told a reporters, brandishing a list of several pages which he chose to keep confidential.

They include the April 4 sarin gas attack on the opposition-held town of Khan Sheikhun. "All these allegations are recorded by our experts, who follow this every day from our operations center," Uzumcu said.

"The mission, if it goes ahead, will not be an easy one. The Syrian regime had enough time to erase whatever traces were left (of the chemical attack). It will have time to do that until the watchdog arrives in Syria," said Hamdan Al-Shehri, a political analyst and international relations expert.

"The regime has been condemned for using chemical weapons against



civilians, and this was proven by the British and the French, who conducted tests on samples taken from the victims. The question is, will there be any accountability based on the results of the new mission," Al-Shehri added.

The OPCW is currently trying to ensure it is safe enough to deploy its fact-finding team to the town for further analysis, after Uzumcu said last week that "incontrovertible" test results from OPCW-designated labs on samples taken from victims showed sarin gas or a similar substance had been used.

The regime of Syrian President Bashar Assad has "already stated that it would support this mission, actually it has invited us to go via Damascus," he said.

"The problem is that this area is controlled by different armed opposition groups, so we need to strike some deals with them to ensure a temporary cease-fire, which we understand the Syrian government is willing to do," he added.

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he Islamic Centre Starwood is a branch of Darul Ihsan Centre. In this issue we interview Maulana Huzaifa Noor, who is the Imam of the Sunford Masjid in Phoenix and the manager of the Islamic Centre on the achievements and challenges of Muslims in this locality.

Can you give us a brief geographic history of Phoenix and Muslims living there?

Phoenix is a well-populated, diverse locality, situated Northwest of Durban, Kwa-Zulu Natal. It was established in 1976. It has a total population of approximately 200 000 residents. Muslims make up approximately 10% of the population.

How long are you residing in Phoenix and what is your bservation as an Alim in this community?

I am residing in Phoenix for the past 30 years. Alhumdulillah, the community of Phoenix has grown in leaps and bounds in many respects. Religiously there is a greater awareness of Deen amongst the people. Enthusiasm for learning and practicing Deen is on the rise.

What are some of the major achievements of the Muslims of Phoenix?

Islamic Centre Starwood (Phoenix)



The achievements of Muslims in Phoenix are primarily the establishment of Masjids, Musallas, Maktabs, schools and Madrasahs for young Muslims and several community organisations and charity forums. The establishment of a fully-fledged Muslim School and Hifz Academy are amongst the many achievements of this community. Phoenix had the honour of hosting the KZN provincial Ijtima in 2010 which was well organised and received by the community. Alhumdullilah, numerous Ulama have settled in Phoenix and serve the community selflessly.

What are some of the challenges faced by the Muslims of Phoenix?

Like other communities, the scourge of drugs is a serious challenge within the Muslim community of Phoenix, leading to crime and other societal complications. There are also a

number of ideological challenges that are targeting the youth and vulnerable. Economic instability within many families also remains an issue. General lack of Islamic knowledge and values. In order to safe guard and protect our Iman and beliefs, close association with the Ulama is of paramount importance.

Can you give us a background of the Islamic Centre Starwood?

Residents of Phoenix who required social and welfare assistance would travel long distances in order to get help. There was a need to establish a centre in Phoenix to cater for the needs of the people that is convenient and accessible. With the guidance and duas of the Ulama of Phoenix, the Islamic Centre Starwood was established by Darul Ihsan in February 2012 thereby filling this void. However, there remains much room for extension of the services and activities for the community.

What are the services provided by the centre?

The office renders financial assistance to eligible recipients. Assistance is provided in the form of rental, food vouchers, metro bills, household necessities, medicine, clothing, stationery, school uniforms, sandwiches to schools and many other areas. Social and marital counselling, learner support, spiritual upliftment, motivation, etc is also rendered. There is also a focus on empowerment to help, guide and fund people to a position of self-sufficiency. Visits to schools, hospitals, homes, etc. are also conducted. Outreach programmes for feeding, education, youth adventures, workshops, etc. are coordinated from the office. The esteemed Ulama of Phoenix utilise the office as a convenient venue for their planning sessions and other meetings.

Sleeping and waking up early




ur sleeping pattern plays a major role in our ability to function effectively during the day.

Futile Arguments

t seems as if everyone has something to argue about these days. Arguing is a waste of precious time and a diversion of shaytaan, from carrying out good deeds or rendering services to

We do not have to worry about arguing with every other person. We have got no time to argue with people. Only that person will go around arguing with people who has got the time. ...He has got the time to waste, therefore he will go around arguing.

The person whose heart is connected with Allah Ta'ala does not have the time for arguments, for fights, for unnecessary quarrels and for wasting time over useless, futile activities.

Rasulullah 🗯 said: "I guarantee a house in the outskirts of Paradise to the one who forsakes argument even when he is in the right."

If we are mindful of this Hadith and have Yaqeen (conviction) on the words of Rasulullah ﷺ, many arguments would not even surface.

Differing with Respect

llah Ta'ala states in the Noble Quran: "Obey Allah and the Nabi 🗯 and do not dispute with one another lest you falter and your strength departs from you."

(Surah Anfal V.46)

Islam is a balanced and moderate way of life. Accordingly our Deen allows for academic differences of opinion regarding laws and rulings as long as these are within the required parameters. Such differences are praiseworthy and a form of blessing as they accommodate the different temperaments of people and creates ease and flexibility amongst them.

Unfortunately, due to intolerance and ignorance some make these differences the basis for disputes and quarrels and sow confusion in the ranks of the general Muslim public. They adopt a dogmatic, rigid and uncompromising position that causes tension and friction among Muslims. Some regard everyone else as deviated and regard only themselves to be correct and authentic.

In an even more dangerous approach, some boldly and publicly condemn other Ulama and scholars.

Every Muslim should endeavour to practice on Islam to the best of his ability and seek guidance from a reputable Alim or Mufti. If uncertain about a matter, refer to the scholars that one has confidence in, seek their guidance and practice upon it.

At no point should anyone feel that he is better or his opinion is more correct than that of others. This thinking is the result of pride which is a destructive malady that needs reformation. Avoid being judgmental of others as you are not aware of their circumstances. You will not be answerable about the actions of others but will be questioned about your own.

That we shall differ, is not the issue. The issue is, how we respond to a difference of opinion and what should be our relationship with someone of a different opinion.

May Allah Ta'ala make us from those who promote love, understanding and harmony.

I have read that one can only miss his fast if one is a traveller at sehri time. What will be the ruling of an individual who is travelling abroad but his flight is after sunrise time (meaning he is still at home at sehri time)? If that person needs to fast, how will he do Iftar because different countries have different iftar times?

A person who is not travelling at the time of Sehri must observe the fast. One who is fasting whilst travelling makes Iftar according to the local time of Iftar (sunset) wherever one is.

Can one insert Vicks into the nostrils whilst fasting?

This should be avoided whilst fasting. One may however use vicks externally and apply it to the forehead and chest etc.

If one masturbates in Ramadan will the fast be Qadha or does one have to pay Kaffarah as well? What is the ruling if one masturbates during one fast of Ramadan? If there is Kaffarah - what is it?

Firstly, it should be remembered that masturbating for both males and females is Haraam (forbidden)

in Islam and an evil act. Masturbating whilst fasting is an even more serious offence and deprives one of the blessings of Ramadan as it causes the fast to break. There is only Qadha for this, no Kaffarah. One should make abundant Taubah and Istighfar and firmly resolve never to do this again.

I would like to know, if a person was in Saudi Arabia when Ramadan began and started a day earlier. He is making Eid in South Africa. If Ramadan is 30 days here in South Africa it would mean he is keeping 31 fasts altogether. Some say he should skip one fast and have Eid a day earlier. Please can you give me some guidance regarding this?

If one commenced the fast a day earlier in another part of the world and was then spending the end part of Ramadan elsewhere where the people around you will still be fasting their 30th day of Ramadan then one will fast with the people (on your 31st day) and make Eid thereafter with the people locally even if it means that one fasts 31 days.

Is it permissible to pay for the fasts that I missed for an entire Ramadan due to Nifas (post-natal bleeding)?

No, Fidyah (paying for the fasts) will not suffice. The missed fasts should be made-up after Ramadan when you attain purity and can manage fasting.

In terms of who can pay Fidyah, Allah Ta'ala has granted permission to people who have no hope of ever fasting like those who are very old, chronically/terminally ill, etc., to compensate each fast by feeding a poor and needy person (two meals a day).

The Jurists have equated this amount to that of Sadaqatul Fitr (money given before Eid day to the poor). This could be given at the beginning of Ramadan or at the end (Shaami). This money cannot be discharged before Ramadan.

Those who have hope of recovery and can manage the fast later must make Qadha of these after Ramadan whenever they can manage. Fidyah given in such a case will not suffice.

I'm recently married and my mother in law wants to gift me with gold bangles but she asked if I've paid Zakah yet for this year. I replied no, as in Ramadan is my set date." She said that she just paid Zakah on them recently (few months ago) and suggested keeping the bangles in her possession for me (until after Ramadan) and then "officially" gifting and handing over to me.

My question is, if I accept the gold bangles now, is it correct that I will not have to pay Zakah on them; as it hasn't been in my possession for a full year? Should I simply accept the gift after Ramadan?

There is a general misconception with regards to the concept of one lunar year. The simple explanation is that the threshold for being liable to discharge Zakah is that one must have net-Zakaatable assets (i.e. Zakaatable assets minus liabilities) equal to the value of Nisab at the beginning of the Zakaatable year as well as at the end. Thus, if Zakaah is compulsory on the person, then he should discharge Zakah on 2.5% on the full amount of these assets he has at the end of his Zakaatable irrespective of whether all this wealth was in his possession for a complete year or not.

Hence if you were gifted these bangles before Zakah calculation date, you will pay Zakah on these. is Zakaat payable on a provident fund? Must it be paid even before it matures and the person doesn't have any access to it?

Pension/Provident Funds and RA's

Funds are entered into either voluntarily (where one has a choice of opting into or out of the fund) or involuntarily (where company law is that one has to have a pension/provident fund).

In an involuntary (compulsory) pension/provident fund the money kept aside is not yet your wealth according to the Shariah, but rather a gift or favour from your employer that will be made completely over to you in the future. A gift is only complete when complete possession and control has been handed over. Therefore, if this was a compulsory fund then there is no Zakah payable. When one receives the wealth, then at the end of that Zakatable year Zakah will be paid on whatever wealth remains thereof. The entire amount in this case is Halaal as it is a gift from the employer to you.

However, if the fund (non-Islamic pension/provident or RA) was entered into voluntarily, then Zakah is only paid on your total accumulated contributions at your Zakah calculation date. Further, whatever amounts accrue over and above yours and your companies contributions in non-Shariah compliant Funds, is impermissible or at least doubtful and must be given away in charity without the intention of reward.

In Shariah compliant Funds that were entered voluntarily, the entire current market value of the investment is Zakatable as a precautionary measure since it is difficult to ascertain the net-Zakatable assets of the fund.

This answer is not in any way an endorsement of any Shariah Compliant Fund/Company. It is on the answer on the assumption that the Fund is Shariah compliant.

I have calculated my Zakah on the 1st Ramadhaan 1437/2016, the amount I have

to pay is R5000, is it permissible for me to pay my Zakah within the next 12 months or do I have to discharge my Zakaah immediately?

Zakah should not be delayed. Life is not guaranteed nor does one know what one's financial position will be in the future. We

advise that if one cannot pay the Zakah at once then one should try and pay it in advance gradually.

Is Zakah payable on retirement annuities?

Retirement Annuities are Zakatable.

If it is a conventional non Shariah compliant annuity, then Zakah is payable on your total accrued contributions only as the growth should be given away in charity to the poor and needy without the intention of reward.

If you do not have the liquid to pay the Zakah, you can delay payment to the time you receive this money. However, in this case once you receive the wealth you should pay Zakah for all the previous years as well and you should also make a bequest that if Zakah on this amount is outstanding and unfulfilled at the time of your

demise then it should be paid from your estate.

However, if the fund is Shariah compliant then the proceeds over and above your total accumulated contributions are permissible.

Zakah is paid on your proportionate share of the Zakatable assets of the fund. If this cannot be determined then it is safest to pay on the full current value of your share.

I would like to know, for a lady performing Taraweeh Salah, I only know around 14 Surahs, can I repeat the Surahs in Taraweeh Salah?

Yes, you may repeat the Surahs. Hence, if you read from Surah Feel to Surah Naas in the first ten Rakaats then these may be repeated in the second 10 Rakaats.

On completion of the Quran recitation in Taraweeh the Trustees give gifts to the Huffaaz.

They specify that the reward of the Huffaaz is from Allah Ta'ala and their gift is "hadiyya" & it's from their heart. Please advise whether it is permissible to use the gifts?

Ulama have considered it as impermissible to receive a remuneration for reciting the Quran Shareef and leading the Taraweeh Salah.

Generally, since there is the general perception and knowledge that some form of remuneration or gift will be given, hence even if the Hafiz did not ask for a remuneration per se it is best that he dispenses of such gifts.

What is the ruling for those who have missed entire Taraweeh Salah from past years? Does Qadha have to be made for them like missed Fardh/Witr?

There is no doubt that one has deprived oneself from tremendous reward and emulating the Sunnah. However, there is no Qadha for missed Taraweeh and Sunnat Salah once the time has elapsed. Hence once the Fajr time enters one should make Taubah and Istighfar.

I would like to find out if a woman is allowed to wax or thread unwanted hair?

it is permissible for women to remove the hair from their arms and legs etc. by waxing and threading. However one should ensure that in doing so one does not reveal one's Satr to strangers (from navel till below the knee), if this is undertaken by other females. One cannot have these removed by strange males.

NB: One is obliged to conceal the area between the navel and the knee even in front of women and

Mahram male relatives except the husband.

A girl wants to attend a non-Muslim wedding even after parents telling her it's not permissible she still wants to go because she says it's her close friend and the parents are totally against her attending the wedding. She says she will only go for half an hour to show her face?

It is not correct to attend such a function. We suggest that she take a gift beforehand, wish them well and politely excuse herself from attending the function.


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Feeding outreach at the Nsimbini Primary Pchool

Marriage registration – FREE service

he Darul Ihsan Centre offers a free service of registration of marriages in accordance with the South African Marriage Act. In terms of the Act, for a marriage union to be recognised and legal, the marriage must be registered by any office of the Department of Home Affairs, or court or an authorised marriage officer appointed by the Department of Home Affairs.

Two Ulama at the Centre, Mufti Zubair Bayat and Moulana Ahmed Kathrada are registered Marriage Officers (MOs) and are able to register marriages in accordance with the Marriages Act.

PROCEDURE:

For marriage registration purposes, the following requirements must be adhered to:

a) An Ante-nuptial Contract excluding the accrual system must be drawn by an attorney. Cost in drawing up an ANC Contract may vary (You may contact Darul Ihsan for advice).

b) Both spouses must be South African citizens (possessing the green coded ID Document). Marriage officers are not permitted to register a marriage of any one or



both spouses being of foreign origin. In such a case, only the Home Affairs may register the marriage.

c) In the case where any one or both spouses being married (registered) previously, then a court decree of divorce must be produced.

At the time of registration, the following documents are required:

- a) Both spouses must be present with the original ID documents.
- b) Accompanied with three passport size photos of each spouse.
- c) First page of the ANC Contract identifying the Protocol No.

In order to fast track the procedure, a "Marriage Registration Details" form is emailed for completion, thereafter a date is fixed for the actual registration. This Form is downloadable from Darul Ihsan's website.

Dealing with anxiety

I have recently been diagnosed with anxiety as there was no medical explanation for my symptoms. How I should go forward in dealing with this anxiety according to Islamic guidelines, as I do not want to get caught up in medication and therapy?

We are inspired by your question and commend you for seeking your solution to this challenge in 'Islamic guidelines'.

Anxiety and worry are caused by overwhelming conditions and challenges. A Muslim has the perfect answer to anxiety - a concept or state called Tafweedh - which means to resign all affairs to Allah Ta'ala. Once a person develops this state then, irrespective of the trials experienced, a capacity is acquired to move forward with belief and commitment. A true believer is convinced about Allah Ta'ala's divine plan, wisdom and help in all aspects of life. The Greatness and Recognition of Allah Ta'ala becomes the central focus of life.

To support the concept of Tafweedh you will need to meditate over Allah Ta'ala's greatness, be steadfast on obedience and regular with Zikr and other spiritual exercises. A holistic spiritual plan is the best response to the worries of the world. Allah Ta'ala says in the Quran, "Listen attentively, only in the remembrance of Allah will the heart find contentment." (Surah Ra'd)
