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### FREEDOM OF EXPRESSION IS FREEDOM **FROM** INSULT, NOT FREEDOM TO INSULT!

Response to recent cartoon issue

- Each faith community feels a deeprooted emotional attachment to the symbols and personalities it reveres. Muslims are no different. The value system of Islam is underpinned by respect and reverence - reverence for the Almighty, for all the Messengers of the Almighty - including the Prophets Abraham, Noah, Moses, Jesus and Muhammad (peace be upon them all). the angels, the holy scriptures, the holy cities, religious symbols and places of worship, and respect for elders. teachers, leaders, religious scholars, parents, the elderly etc.
- Depicting images of the Prophet (peace be upon him) is strictly forbidden in Islam. The rationale for the prohibition. inter alia, of depicting the Prophet (peace be upon him) is that he was too sublime to be truly portrayed. Furthermore, attempts at portraying him could result in his image being distorted. There are therefore no records of any authentic image or portrait of him anywhere in the world, from any period of Islamic history, which is a significant point of note.

- Any attempt to depict the Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) in illustration is an attempt to depict the sacrosanct, which is not allowed. The nature of cartoons is to satirise and trivialise. This is clearly not acceptable in the case of a personality who is held in the highest esteem by almost 2 billion people globally.
- Irrespective of what the motive is for the repeated publishing and displaying of these blasphemous cartoons whether for cheap publicity, political gains, deliberate provocation, or due to sheer ignorance - it is grossly offensive and highly insensitive and will always be rejected by all people of morality with the contempt it deserves!
- Muslims accept the principle of constructive freedom of expression, but not the freedom to wantonly insult, which is sometimes deviously and deceptively masqueraded as freedom of expression. True freedom of expression is freedom FROM insult, not freedom TO insult! Freedom to insult has ultimately resulted in hatred, bigotry and even destruction. Humour that is

The media and others view this as an infringement of the right of freedom of speech. However, one aspect that is often overlooked is that no right is absolute: there are inherent limitations. Every right is counterbalanced against other rights. Every right has to be exercised with utmost responsibility.

These personalities were the true lovers of Rasulullah # and the indication of this love is that every facet of their lives is illuminated with the adherence to the Sunnah. Every action is done, bearing in mind that it is not contrary to the Sunnah. Love is related to the heart. Anyone can claim and make a hue and cry that he is a lover of Rasulullah #, but the sign of that love is to follow the Sunnah.

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
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# Tertiary learners attend motivation programme at Darul Ihsan

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
# Whilst the World rages, a Believer is courageous...

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# The Difference between Lillah and Sadaqah

Q: What is the meaning of the terms Lillah and Sadaqah and is there a difference between the two?

A: In contemporary times, the terms Sadaqah and Lillah are generally used refer to Nafl (voluntary) charity.

Sadaqah generally is regarded to be for the benefit of the poor (irrespective of whether they are Muslims and recipients of Zakaat or not). Lillah is commonly understood to be for any Deeni cause such as the establishment and mantaining of Masajid, Madrasahs, graveyards, and other Deeni institutions, etc. It not only restricted for the benefit of the poor.

However, apart from the common usage, Sadaqah, technically can also refer to compulsory charity. An example of this is Sadaqatul Fitr.

Hence, whilst the term Lillah is specific to voluntary charity, the term Sadaqah is technically more general and may refer to compulsory charities as well. Where Sadaqah refers to compulsory charity, then it should be restricted to those who are eligible to accept Zakaat.

Given the above, we advise that when institutions are being given Sadaqah one should specify it to be either optional or compulsory and if optional, one should specify whether it is restricted to the poor only or if it could be used for any other Deeni cause.

Is it permissible to use a braai stand at a public place, if one puts foil or a grill mat over the griddle?

Using a braai griddle in a public place should be avoided as far as possible to avoid contamination. However, if it is thoroughly washed and sanitised then using it will not be impermissible. If a foil or grill mat is used then it would be better.

Until what age should a brother and sister share the same room?

Children from the age of 9 years must be made to sleep on separate beds. The separation of beds should start before this age so that they are already accustomed to sleeping on their own.

Nowadays boys and girls should also be separated into separate rooms where possible. The awareness levels and exposure of children requires parents to be cautious and proactive.

I would like to know the Islamic ruling with regard to smoking marijuana (cannabis/weed/dagga/zol, etc.)

All intoxicants are Haram and prohibited. To consume (drink/smoke/inject/ingest) any intoxicant including marijuana (weed/dagga/cannabis) is clearly prohibited. The spiritual, physical and societal harms of drugs and intoxicants are devastating.

Can I perform Tahiyatul Wudhu before Salatul Fajr? According to the Hanafi jurists, once the time of Fajr has entered only the Sunnats of Fajr can be performed before the Fardh of Fajr.

If the Tahiyyatul Wudhu was commenced prior to the entry of Fajr time, it would be permissible.

However, if the time of Fajr had already entered then only the Sunnats of Fajr should be performed.

Together with the Sunnats of Fajr, one may make the intention of Tahiyyatul Wudhu as well. It is hoped that the reward shall be attained accordingly.

If a man marries a woman who has not sat for her Iddah, will the Nikah be valid?

Observing Iddah is a Quranic obligation upon a woman. Nikah to a woman whilst she is observing her Iddah is invalid.

If a woman failed to observe her Iddah, she will be sinful. However, making Nikah with a woman whose Iddah period has expired completely is permissible.

I want to know what is the ruling on a widow travelling after Iddat? Can my sons in law be my mahram?

Principally, in terms of the Hanafi School a woman travelling on a journey of more than 77 kms must be accompanied by her husband or a relative who qualifies as a 'mahram'.

Islamically the son in law does qualify as a mahram to his mother in law and she may travel with him. However, due to prevailing



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conditions, Ulama have emphasized that due caution and discretion be exercised in this regard.

Are you allowed to play a game on an agreement that the losers will buy the winners something, like a prize?

This is tantamount to gambling and hence, impermissible.

If the teacher listens to each student's Quran lesson individually, and the same sajdah verse is recited by each student, how many sajdahs do each of them make? Note that each student is able to hear the other student's recitation.

In the mentioned scenario, if the same verse of sajdah tilawat is repeated and heard in the same gathering/sitting then only one sajdah is Wajib on each person.

Is hunting allowed in the sacred months?

In principle, hunting is permissible in all months of the year including the sacred Islamic months. Hunting is prohibited for a person who is within the boundaries of the Haram and one who is in a state of Ihram for Hajj or Umrah.

Is it permissible to make Tayammum if one fears missing the Janazah Salah?

If there is a fear that Janazah Salah will be missed due to making wudhu then it would be permissible to make

Tayammum and join the Janazah Salah even though water is available. This only applies to Janazah and Eid Salah.

Is it permissible for the wife to ask her husband for his phone and or computer password if she is suspicious about him?

The husband and wife should enjoy a relationship of trust and love. More importantly there shouldn't be anything that the husband or wife does that raises suspicion towards each other. If there is a concern this should be discussed with respect and in a manner that does not lead to further tension and conflict. If the matter escalates and parties are unable to resolve between themselves then they should refer it for Islamic mediation.

Hazrat Umar & narrates from Rasulullah \*, "The best action is to bring happiness to a fellow Muslim, either by concealing his faults, satiating his hunger or fulfilling his need." (Al Mu'jamul Awsat lit Tabrani)

Hazrat Anas 🚕 narrates that Nabi 🏶 said: "Whoever meets his Muslim brother and makes him happy with something that Allah likes. Allah will make him happy on the Day of Qiyamah." (Al Mu'jamus Saghir lit

### Replying to the Azan

The Azan is the arabic term for the call to prayer. When the Azan for Salah is called out it is mustahab (rewarding) to reply to the Azan by repeating the words after the Muazzin. This practice has been encouraged in a number of Ahadith.

Hazrat Abdullah ibn Amr ibn Aas 🐞 reports that Rasulullah \* said, "When you hear the Muazzin then repeat what he savs ..." (Sahih Muslim)

Hazrat Umar & narrates that Rasulullah &. "When the Muazzin says 'Allahu Akbar Allahu Akbar' then the one who savs 'Allahu Akbar Allahu Akbar' ...(and continuous mentioning the other words of the Azan)..., - when (the Muazzin) says Lailaha Illallah, then the one who says Lailaha Illallah from the heart (with conviction), will enter Jannah." (Sahih Muslim)

Hazrat Abu Hurairah & narrates, "We were with Rasulullah & when Hazrat Bilal & stood up to call out the Azan. When he completed the Azan, Rasulullah & said, Whoever says these words with conviction will enter Jannah.'" (Sunan Nasai)

It is understood from these Ahadith that in addition to responding to the Azan by proceeding for Salah, we should also respond to the words of the Azan...READ **MORE**

#### Cars set on fire, shops looted


The article "Cars set on fire, shops looted," (Daily News, October 13) and "Alarm at rise in security costs," (front page, October 12) refer.
